Johann Werner Krauss, the former Superintendent of Eisfeld and immortal, because fundamental chronicler of our country, wrote in 1752 in his "Beyträge to explain the Hochfürstl. Saxony-Hildburg- Church, School, and Land History "II, 338:" This fame has to be left to the city of Hildburghausen and its inhabitants, who have been very generous with regard to mild matters. " Just as, in 1560, the famous Rector of the Klosterschule Jlefeld, Michael Neander, thanked the council here for the many stiveuäia and deuecécia that it manages to maintain in its eating and to restore it to the broken. In fact, only a few cities of Thuringia of the same or similar size are found with the same or nearly as many foundations and legacies. Nevertheless, apart from what Krauss brought to 1752, there was no such thing as a work encompassing the entire foundation of the town and country of the diocese of Hildburghausen from the earliest times to the present day. And yet the cultural-historical interest, as well as the great practical significance of such writing, especially as regards the scholarship system, should have long since led to it. Thus, on the occasion of the revision of my chronicle of 1886, as well as the final processing of my chronicle of the Diocese and the former Duchy of Hildburghausen, I then searched all the relevant records of the local Council of Archives, organized by the city secretary M. 1 The oldest local foundations were of ecclesiastical nature, the so-called "Days of the Year", "Aims aimiversai", "Masses of Souls", "Vigilions" held by the priests in the churches on the death of the souls of the benefactors. The interest on the principal amount, which was generally 20 fl., Would be given to a pastor, chaplain, vicar, schoolmaster, cantor, kirchner, and sergeant for their efforts. In 1528, with the resettlement, 470 fl. Came from those masses of souls to improve the salaries of the Kirchner and Schulbedienten in the Gotteskasten. Founders of those anniversaries were u. a. the sexes v. Hessberg, Schrimpf, Trutwein, Schippel, Thym, Bierthumpfel, Schwemlin. The foundation of the annual days was mostly preceded by a Vikari or early Mass to the St. Catharine altar, the altar of St. ViiAiu. Nariae, Sauetae Lineis, Salvatoris Luiisti, S.
